Die register is saamgestel uit inligting vervat in die beursbrosjures en 1970-jaarboeke van die verskillende universiteite, inligting wat skriftelik verkry is van instansies en organisasies wat toekennings beskikbaar stel, en inligting wat uit persaankondigings en ander bronne verkry is.

Die publikasie is in 'n Afrikaanse seksie en 'n Engelse seksie ingedeel. Die Afrikaanse seksie bevat toekennings wat aan die Afrikaansmediumuniversiteite (insluitende die universiteite van Port Elizabeth en Suid-Afrika) beskikbaar is. INTRODUCTION

This publication is a revision of "Awards available for post-graduate study in the Republic of South Africa and overseas" which was published by the former National Bureau of Educational and Social Research in 1967.

The register has been compiled from information included in the bursary brochures and 1970 calendars of the various universities, written information obtained from organizations providing awards, and information obtained from press announcements and other sources.

The publication is divided into two sections, viz an Afrikaans section and an English section. The Afrikaans section contains awards available at the Afrikaans-medium universities (including the universities of Port Elizabeth and South Africa). The English section covers awards made available by the English-medium universities (including the universities of Port Elizabeth and South Africa). In addition a general section comprising 150 awards which are not restricted to a specific university, is included in the English section.

If the title of a bursary is known to the reader the alphabetical index can be consulted to obtain the relevant reference and page numbers. If the reader wishes to ascertain which awards are available for study in a specific field, the subject index can be used to find the specific reference numbers.
