### Aim of the Research

- Low income levels mostly grants and/remittances
- High levels of poverty

### Research Methodology

- 2003 by HSRC Census study of Kopanong community in
- Targeted all previously disadvantaged communities - 5254 households
- Reached 98% households
- A two-page census record sheet used to collect information about each household and
- This analysis looks at orphan status, type of school attendance and meals intake carer, access to birth certificates, grants


# Findings - orphan prevalence






#### Findings - Access to birth certificates by caregiver






## Findings - type of child grants




